Our INTERNATIONAL APPROACH

We offer scientific French language courses and specific courses in English to all our Erasmus students which provide credits and are specially adapted to them.

We also organize summer programs on demand for our international incoming exchange students.

The university has a "buddy system" and ensures specific coaching for local students engaging as "buddies". This close relationship between students improves the integration of incoming students to the local student's community. Each international student who wishes to participate in this programme is teamed up with a French student, a "buddy", throughout his semester /year of study at Clermont-Ferrand.

Moreover, we created a monthly "rendez-vous" around the international student community which is called "Petits déjeuners de l'international". It helps students meet regularly and share a multilingual and multicultural breakfast.

It is our responsibility to prepare our students to play a major role in a multicultural society in helping them become the global citizens of tomorrow.

Because knowledge ignores boundaries, we believe that creating links with foreign institu-tions not only provides our students with intellectual skills but also with social and cultural qualities that will help them succeed in an open world and in a globally integrated job mar-ket. It also makes them capable of understanding better the others by adopting an open-minded attitude.

Historically Europe is at the crossroads of civilizations and France is known to be the 4th country in the world which welcomes the most important number of international students.

Our University which was recently created – January 2017 – is the merging of two interna-tional universities (Blaise Pascal university and University of Auvergne). It strongly believes that welcoming international students is an immeasurably cultural richness for its campus life. We have decided to invest in the development of teaching and research partnerships with more than 300 Erasmus partners and with about 200 other foreign universities around the rest of the world. Each year we welcome around 800 international students who come to study under the terms of these agreements.

But our international student community is even larger than that as we must not forget the 400 students who come to learn French in our French as a Foreign Language Center (FLEU¬RA Center) and the 3000 students who come individually to follow one of our 200 diplomas. On the whole, we reach a community of roughly international 5000 students which repre-sents 13% of our 38 000 registered students. 

Nationals of EU member countries

If you are a national of a member state of the European Union (EU) or the European Economic Area (EEA), you may apply directly to the institution(s) of interest to you. You are not required to follow any particular process to enter French higher education beyond the first year. You are not even required to obtain a visa.

Other students

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If you live in EU countries but are not a citizen, you will have to apply for a student visa at the French consulate in the country in which you reside. Different application procedures apply depending on what you will be studying in France, and how long you will need to live in France in order to complete your studies. Whether you are taking part in an exchange programme, enrolling at a French educational institution as an independent student, or as part of a programme organised by an institution in your home country, you will need to provide the consulate with the following France study visa requirements:

- An official enrolment or acceptance letter on the headed paper of the institution,
- The proof that you have sufficient funds,
- An airline ticket/reservation showing date of departure,
- Proof that you have accommodation,
- Proof that you have medical insurance.



National MEDICAL INSURANCE SCHEME

The cost of a medical visit with a general practitioner is usually 25 €. The doctor will give you a form specifying the treatment dispensed, which has to be sent to your home insurance office. On presentation of the prescription the chemist will fill in a form specifying all medication bought. This has to be sent to your home insurance office too to get reimbursed.

Students from EU countries

You must arrive in France with the European Health Insurance Card, which is to be obtained before you leave your home country. However, this does not guarantee complete reimbursement of medical expenses. We strongly advise you to take out complementary health insurance called "mutuelle" with the LMDE or with the SMERRA (specialized in student health insurance) to cover the remaining medical expenses.

Students from non EU countries

We strongly advise you to join the national insurance scheme of the French Social Security System for the entire academic year. However, this does not guarantee complete reimbursement of medical expenses. We strongly advise you to take out complementary health insurance called "mutuelle" to cover the remaining medical expenses if you don't have one in your home country.

French Social Security System

Students from Quebec

Students who are nationals of Quebec must arrive in France with the SE-401-Q-102-bis form, or the SE-401-Q-106 form (which can be obtained from their local Social Security Office at home). These forms give dispensation from joining student requirements in the French social security system.

If students have already contracted a public social security and health insurance policy in their home country, or if they are covered by a private insurance policy abroad, they must arrive in France with an official certificate, translated into French or English.

Students WITH A DISABILITY

The "Service Université Handicap" (SUH) will be able to help students with a disability at their arrival and during their stay.

Good to know if you want TO RENT A PRIVATE ROOM/FLAT

• The tenancy agreement (or « bail ») set up the rules regulating the renting of an accommodation (length, rent-money, cancellation). Those rules are established by the French legislation in force (law of the 6 of July 1989 modified by the 24th July 1994 law).

• The lease agreement is a contract that has imperatively to be written up, dated and signed by the two parties. The third party guarantee could be necessary for the signature. We advise you to do a written check-in before you enter your flat.

• The guarantor is the person or the organization (your bank for instance) who/which commit itself to the owner in paying the renting debts of the tenant, in a writing document called « acte de cautionnement"/guarantee act).

The owner is not allowed to ask for a guarantee if he already has a locative risks cover or a private insurance. The owner is also not allowed to refuse the guarantee of a person who doesn't have the French citizenship and who lives in a foreign country.

• A security deposit is an amount of money that is given temporarily as security against loss of or damage. This may be required when do the check-in. This can't be more than one month and has to be written in the lease.

• Before the signature don't forget to supply a **locative insurance certification**. In case of absence of this document, the owner is allowed to cancel your lease agreement.

Flat Sharing

Interest

Living with roommates permit yourself to live in a largest accommodation while paving less. (Roommates have to fairly share, services charges and rent) It's often quite difficult to live alone in a whole new city or country. Thus living with roommates enables yourself to make friends and helps you in facing the troubles of everyday life. But living together can't only be resumed to funny moments as flat-sharing implies sharing the space, tasks, and expenses and adapting yourself to your roommates' own pace. Thus it's quite useful and necessary to establish rules as soon as you move in, in order to live in a "peaceful cohabitation".

How does it work?

Either there are several rental contracts (that is to say as much lease agreements as roommates). In that case every roommate has to sign individually a contract with the owner. This one thus allows an exclusive enjoyment of certain rooms of the flat and a common access to kitchen or sanitation.

Either there is only one rental contract signed by all the roommates. In that case the owner let the roommates organize themselves for the sharing of the rented space.

The flat-sharing lease agreement may be composed of a clause of solidarity bounding the roommates. This clause implies that every roommate is responsible for the whole lease agreement' obligations (for instance the owner could ask to a single roommate for the whole rent). Thus if one of the flat-sharers doesn't pay its part of the rent, the owner is allowed to claim this sum to the other

Be careful: If your lease agreement implies a solidarity clause, in case of departure of a flat-sharer, this one can still be accountable for the rent until the end of the lease agreement.

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Before the beginning of the application you absolutely need to have the following documents in your possession:

- your tax return or tax assessment
- your lease agreement
- a rent receipt or a rent certificate
- your bank account details (RIB)

The online application is based on a five stages form:

- You take cognizance of the access conditions incumbent to an online application
- You input information concerning:
 - your familial and professional status,
 - your funds and accommodation.

- A recap summarizes the declared pieces of information
- You absolutely need to sign it before sending it to the CAF with the necessary vouchers.
- Your application will be taken into account as soon as the CAF will receive your recap and vouchers.

Be careful: You couldn't modify those pieces of information once they are validated. Let's download this recap and print it. Then, send it to the CAF postal address.

Application **PROCESS**

Application in your home university

First of all, you have to contact your home university international office in order to ask them how to apply for an exchange program. Be aware that a B2 level of French may be required to follow some classes. The university will help you to register to French as a Foreign Language (FLE) classes if you need. The FLE classes are free for Erasmus students coming to UCA.

Application form on Moveon

When you will be selected by your home university, you will have to complete our application form online through the Moveon application form on our website: www.uca.fr

Deadlines are:

- Fall semester : May 15
- Academic Year : May 15
- Spring semester : November 15

The application form online has to be complete with that documents :

- The L.A signed by the professor who is responsible for your exchange in your university,

- the room reservation form if you are interested by a room at the CROUS (see page 24).

- a copy of your identity card or passport

- a mobility certificate from your home university

Confirmations

We will send you the letter of acceptance and a confirmation of reservation if you apply for a room in our university residences.

Please note that every modification of cancellation of stay must be notified to your home university and to us!

Registration, **TUITION FEES AND STUDENT CARD**

The registration is done by your administrative contact/referent in your host faculty. You don't have to pay any tuition fee.

The registration at the University will allow you to be identified as a UCA student, and get your student card. The student car will allow you to :

- pay at the university restaurants and load money : www.izly.fr
- have discounts in a lot of places like restaurants and cinemas,
- borrow books and documents from the university libraries,
- use the intranet (ENT)...

Learning agreement and **EUROPEAN CREDITS TRANSFER SYSTEM**

A learning agreement (L.A) for each semester is required for all incoming exchange students. It is a formal agreement between the student, its home university and its host university. All the lessons that the student wants to follow have to be written in the L.A.

The European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) is a standard for comparing the study attainment and performance of students of higher education across the European Union and other collaborating European countries. For successfully completed studies, ECTS credits are awarded. One academic year corresponds to 60 ECTS (30 ECTS per semester). Please note that ECTS credits won't be awarded if the student doesn't attend the class and do not undertake the assessment.

Classes, EXAMS AND RESITS

Exchange students may take courses only in fields which have been included in the agreement of cooperation with their home university. The courses list is given by the pedagogical referent in every school or faculty. They will be able to advise foreign student which courses are most suitable for them. During the first weeks in Clermont-Ferrand, students will have to choose their courses and complete their Learning Agreement following their home institution requirements.

A student who follows a course is required to take the corresponding exam. The courses choice may change during the first weeks (if some courses may be far from the student expectations or if there is a problem with the agenda during the academic year). If the courses list changes, the student will have to change his learning agreement and make it signed by both home and host universities. That document has to be signed by each party during the exchange period so as a Transcript of Records may be delivered at the end of the program.

For students whose grade is under 10/20, a resit exam may be organized at his or her request. The new grade will replace the old one if it is better. If the student misses the exam he won't be able to do the recovery exam he or she will only be able to do it with a certificate from a doctor or for any very serious reason.

EVERYDAY LIFE

How to open A BANK ACCOUNT?

Why opening a French bank account?

If you plan to stay in France for more than three months, it's highly recommended to open a bank account in a French bankinghouse. Indeed, many organizations such as the CAF or the French Health insurance (Sécurité Sociale) only grant you money via bank transfers. Furthermore, opening a bank account allows you to get a check book or/and a credit card.

Opening conditions

In order to open a bank account you imperatively need to supply the following documents:

- A valid identity card or a passport
 A residence permit or a receipt
 (except for European students)
- A proof of domicile (electricity bill, a receipt for rent payment, proof of residence)

How to find a bank?

Before following any procedures, let's inquire from your main bank in your home country if there's any partnership with a French bank-house which would simplify your investigations. If it's not the case, be careful to compare the differences between every bank-house. Indeed some of them offer preferential rates to students (half price services, loyalty points). Once you've made your choice, let's contact the bank and make sure to deposit at least 15€ on your new bank account. You generally get your check book and credit card a few days after the opening of your account.

French characteristics

The debit card or credit card is not free (you have to pay between 15€ et 40€ per year). Check books are often free but some bank houses can make you pay for it. Checks are necessary to pay your rent, bills, deposit etc... Be careful that nowadays many stores are no longer up accepting your checks. Let's be prudent and always keep another way of payment on you. Let's also be vigilant and let's check regularly that your bank account is still in credit. A lack of credit can bring you to pay "agios" (extra banking fees).

How to **FIND A JOB?**

Legislation and principles

A student is allowed to work for 964 hours maximum per year (around 60% of the annual work's length) under a contract lasting 12 months maximum. The term starts as soon as a long stay visa is delivered to the student. Otherwise, the prefecture is allowed to suspend the student's visa if this one didn't respect the regulations of those working hours.

Foreign students are totally allowed to practice a paid activity during their studies and this without any prior authorization. However in some derogatory cases, a provisional authorization is compulsory (it's the case for Algerian students, students who have to work more than 964 hours per year, and students who only have a temporary long stay visa)

The contract of employment concluded by the student and the employer has to be written up and signed at last on the first day of work of the student.

Transportation

Buses: T2C (Transports de Clermont)



The tram is going across the city from the North to the South and is serving around 31 stops. The ticket is valid

for buses and tram, it costs 1.40€ and remains valid for 70 minutes. If you're intending to use public transport all year long it's advisable to subscribe to the T2C yearly season ticket. Students aged under 26 benefits from a 40% discount.

Trains: SNCF (Société Nationale des Chemins de Fers/ National Society of railroads) www.voyages-sncf.com

The SNCF has two stations in Clermont-Ferrand; one of them is situated next to the city center while the other one is in the zone of la Pardieu. SNCF offers specific subscriptions for students like the carte Découverte 12-25 (discovery card) and the "billets internes étudiants".
